"For example, a reporter for the Arizona Republic needed any information we had about the Pioneer Hotel fire. There been requests for information about Sarah Lemmon, and for information about a 1954 performance at the Temple of Music and Art. I check through our collections and compile what I can find for them. "

Heather says she is looking forward soon to working in the basement with the historical artifacts.

While there are college students working at the Historical Society, Heather is by far the youngest volunteer there.

"They are impressed that my school gives me the flexibility to do something like this," she says.

Heather has ben passionate about history for years. "I'm planning on majoring in history. I'm particularly interested in U.S history, in the treatment of Native Americans in both North and South America, in the Civil War, on through the turn of the 20th century."

For her senior project, Heather is combining photography, creative writing, and research to create a photo essay about the impact of western expansion on native American culture, perhaps focussing on Apache culture.

And then they enticed him back to Kino by making troll treats out of every troll's favorite foods -- chocolate and marzipan!

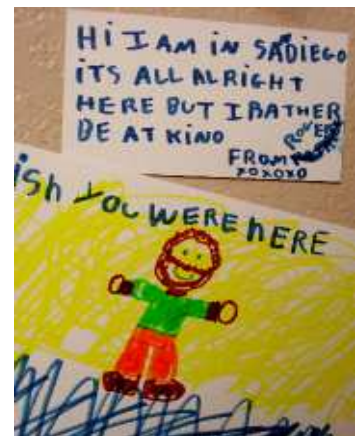
